Referring Children for Special Needs Help in Fresno County

Assessment Center for Children

“One Call Center”: 225-1102 ext 501 or 502

Children 0-5 years old who are at risk for developmental delay (e.g., fail in one or more domain(s) on the Ages and Stages Questionnaire), call the Assessment Center for Children (ACC) and **seek advice** as to where to refer the child. The ACC generally takes referrals on children with multiple delays (i.e., 3 or more). However, they can direct providers and others to the appropriate agency where children may need to be evaluated.

Early Start (Children under 3 years old)
