Yesterday and Today

UCSF Fresno was created as a graduate medical education (residency training) campus of UC San Francisco in 1975 with support from the state legislature and Veterans Administration to address physician shortages in the San Joaquin Valley.

Today, UCSF Fresno is the largest physician training program between San Francisco and Los Angeles. UCSF Fresno also trains about 300 medical students on a rotating basis each year. Training and patient care take place at partner hospitals, clinics and other affiliated clinical sites.

In July 2018, the UCSF School of Medicine received approval from the national medical school accrediting body, the Liaison Committee on Medical Education, to establish UCSF Fresno as a regional medical campus.

Regional Campus

The regional campus designation makes UCSF the degree-granting institution for the University of California's San Joaquin Valley Program in Medical Education (SJV PRIME) and paves the way for medical

students enrolled in the program to spend the bulk of their training at UCSF Fresno and in the Valley. The transfer of the program to UCSF leverages the significant medical education infrastructure at UCSF Fresno.

San Joaquin Valley PRIME

SJV PRIME is the sixth program in UC's programs in medical education. The program prepares medical students to be excellent clinicians and patient advocates for underserved communities, especially in the San Joaquin Valley.

SJV PRIME was established in 2010 as a partnership among the UC Davis School of Medicine, UC Merced, UCSF Fresno and the UCSF School of Medicine. The first class of students started in 2011.

Six students started in the new UCSF SJV PRIME in fall of 2019. Twelve students started in 2020. UC Merced continues to be an important partner. Students enrolled in the program spend 18 months at UCSF in San Francisco and then move to the Fresno regional campus for the remainder of their medical school training in the Valley.

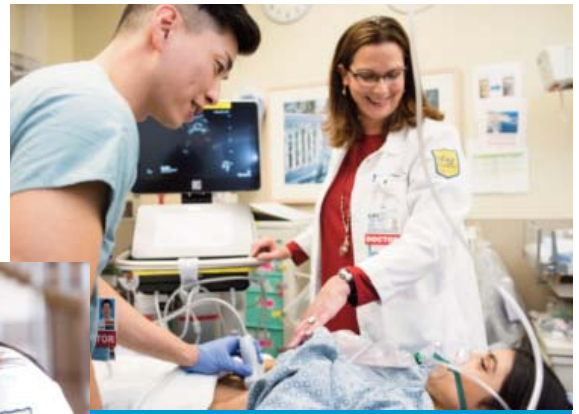
