

Fact Sheet:

Community Regional Medical Center

Background

Community Regional Medical Center is the flagship of Community Medical Centers' four acute-care facilities, with an average daily census of 598 patients. The four facilities under Community Regional's license see a combined total of 772 inpatients a day.

It began in 1897 with Celia Burnett, proprietor of a successful boarding house at the southeast corner of Fulton and Calaveras streets in Fresno. She joined forces with Fresno physicians to form a private hospital called the Burnett Sanitarium.

Today, this academic-affiliated medical center is located on a 58-acre campus in downtown Fresno. With a full-service, 56,000-square-foot emergency department – one of the largest in California – it's home to the Table Mountain Rancheria Trauma Center and Leon S. Peters Burn Center, the region's only comprehensive burn and Level 1 Trauma Center.

The campus features the Deran Koligian Ambulatory Care Center, a 79,534-square-foot facility partnered with Family Health Care Network to provide care for asthma, dental, diabetes, eye, family and adult practice, HIV/AIDS care, internal medicine, and women and children's clinics. The Prompt Care Center for adults and children with minor illnesses or injuries is also open seven days a week.

The Community Regional campus expanded in 2018 with the completion of the five-story North Medical Plaza, which includes the new home for outpatient dialysis, Leon S. Peters Outpatient Rehabilitation Center (CORC) and the Pediatric Specialty Center. A new seven-story, 1,400-stall employee parking garage also completed the same year.

Across from Community Regional is Terry's House, a 17,000-square-foot, two-story home that provides a supportive residence for families while their loved ones receive critical care in the hospital.

UCSF Fresno Residency Program

More than 200 doctors from one of the nation's best medical schools receive specialized training each year at Community Regional through the UCSF Fresno Medical Education Program. Residency programs are offered in emergency medicine, family and community medicine, internal medicine, obstetrics/gynecology, oral and maxillofacial surgery, orthopedic surgery, pediatrics, psychiatry and surgery. Fellowships also are offered in acute-care surgery, cardiovascular disease, community pediatrics, emergency medicine education, emergency ultrasound, gastroenterology, head and neck oncology, hematology/oncology, HIV, hospice and palliative medicine, infectious disease, interventional cardiology, maternal-child health, microvascular reconstruction, head and neck oncology, pulmonary and critical care, surgical critical care/trauma, sleep medicine and wilderness medicine.

Accreditation

Every three years, the Joint Commission inspects participating hospitals to gauge quality of care. Community Regional received full re-accreditation in 2019.
