[Central Valley Children's Services Network \(CVCSN\)](#)

CVCSN is the not-for-profit child care resource and referral agency serving Fresno County. This organization provides [referrals](#) to licensed child care (centers and family child care homes) and administers [child care subsidies](#), in addition to offering a number of other family services.

Community Care Licensing is the California Department of Social Services division responsible for issuing child care licenses and monitoring facilities.

[To access the record of a small family child care (licensed for 6-8), you would need to enter the program's facility number or the licensee's name exactly as it appears on the license.]
